English Language

X2 Papers = 160 Marks (80 Marks per paper) (40 Marks per section)

Paper 1


- This exam will test their analysis of *fiction* texts on unseen piece of writing from either
 the 20th or 21st century
- They will also be required to produce a creative piece of writing either describing or narrating
- They will also be tested on spelling, punctuation and grammar.

Paper 2

- This exam will test their analysis of non-fiction texts with two linked sources from different time periods, one being from the 19th century
- They will also be required to produce a written text to a specified audience in which they give their own viewpoint
- Grade Boundaries: 9 = 128, 8 = 118, 7=106, 6=97, 5=86 and 4 = 61


ENGLISH LITERATURE EXAM PAPER 1

- 50% EXAM 1 Shakespeare and the 19th century novel
- The students will be examined on the Shakespeare text, 'Macbeth' and 'A Christmas Carol' by Dickens. They will be assessed on their ability to understand how the writers create and develop characters from a given extract and relate across the whole text. They will NOT have access to the whole text in the exam, therefore it is imperative that they know both texts in detail.












ENGLISH LITERATURE EXAM PAPER 2

- The students will be examined on 'An Inspector Calls', poetry from the 'Power and Conflict' Anthology and two unseen poems.
- They will be assessed on their ability to identify, analyse and interpret how writers use language and they will also be required to compare across two poems.
- They will not have access to the texts in the exam, therefore essential they study and know the texts in detail.






More ways of hel
