## BEHAVIOUR EXPECTED ON SCHOOL TRIPS

Taking other people's children on excursions is a considerable responsibility. A visit may take many weeks, even months of planning, with much correspondence and involves teachers/organisers in a great deal of work.

We expect a high standard of behaviour by Haydon students on school trips. Trips are a privilege and therefore the school reserves the right to exclude or remove a child from a trip if their behaviour does not meet with the standards we expect on a day to day basis in school.

Students requesting to go on such trips, and parents, should be aware of the work that takes place on their behalf and resolve to minimise difficulties by being as co-operative as possible.

During a visit students MUST:-

- Follow instructions given by the trip organiser at all times
- Follow the activities that have been planned for the party and do not opt to do something different
- Avoid noisy, over-excited or attention seeking behaviour
- Show consideration and courtesy towards members of the public, officials and other guests
- Not purchase or consume alcohol, cigarette and/or illegal substances. Children are also not permitted to bring these prohibited items through customs.
- Not be in the rooms of students of the opposite sex
- Be in groups of at least three at all times
- Return to meeting points on time
- Not purchase anything which they are not allowed to purchase in the UK e.g. bangers, films with particular ratings
- NEVER wander off alone

Staff will supervise as much as possible but there are usually times set aside for exploration and/or shopping when this is not practicable. Students are expected to behave impeccably when not supervised so that no problems occur which would spoil the enjoyment of the visit.

If a student behaves inappropriately on a school trip they risk jeopardising their place on all other trips and visits.

The 'Relationship Charter' applies on all trips, and students should expect sanctions on their return to school should their behaviour be inappropriate on a trip.

Students should be aware that they are representing the school and should behave accordingly.

**In order for your child to be permitted to take part in any organised trips by Haydon School, you as the Parent/Carer are agreeing to all of the above. Please be aware that if your child does not comply with the above regulations then they may be sent home at your expense.**
