These are arranged by the students themselves, with support from school, so that students are aware of how to organise and arrange placements. This also increases their awareness of the varying roles/jobs that would be available to them upon completion of the course or further training. We have visits from expectant mothers and new mothers to show skills such as feeding and looking after a baby. Students are introduced to basic paediatric first aid.
