### **The intent of the Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) & Citizenship curriculum**

PSHE aims to help pupils to manage many of the most critical opportunities, challenges and responsibilities they will face growing up.

Citizenship aims to equip students with the skills and knowledge to explore political and social issues critically, to weigh evidence, debate and make reasoned arguments.

### **The Implementation of the PSHE & Citizenship Curriculum Syllabus:**

There are no formal exams for PSHE and Citizenship. The PSHE and Citizenship curriculum is taught at tutor time. In addition, Head of Year assemblies, visiting outside speakers and events such as Safeguarding week link with the core PSHE and Citizenship curriculum syllabus.

Students will have two tutor periods over the two week timetable.
