Year 6 Transition Summer School (29 to 2802 Aug July 2024)

We have around 170 Year 6 students, who will join us in September, signed up for our Transition Summer School. We are delighted to have the opportunity of ensuring these students have a really positive first experience of Haydon School. We have planned a full week of activities – each student will receive a curriculum comprising English, Maths, Science and PE team building activities and other enrichment lessons. Integral to the schemes of work will be the Haydon Values and one of our main aims is to ensure students make new friends and get to know the school environment. We have a great team of staff who are really looking forward to giving the students a positive, fun learning experience, which will serve as an excellent transition to Haydon from their primary school.

We also have just under 150 Year 5 students coming into school on Friday 26th July for a day.

Site Improvements over the summer holidays

It will be another busy summer for our site team. On Dobson's first floor we are going to create two classrooms; one IT suite will be converted into a classroom to accommodate the increased need for a classroom for the humanities team. As we need a second classroom, the IT team will be relocated into another office and their current office will be converted into a classroom too. Our classroom overheating project is due to be completed by the end of August. The rainwater garden in front of the reception is now complete. We are really pleased with the outcome. In August, the second rainwater garden will be completed near undercroft. It will really soften the look of that area and bring some colour to it. We are really happy that every year we continue to improve our school site to provide our students and staff with a pleasant environment to learn and work.



Students had an engaging and interactive mystery challenge that promised to be both educational and fun. The first challenge was : Code Quest. In this cryptic challenge, students worked together to crack codes and unravel hidden messages. This aim of the activity was to hone their problem-solving and logical thinking skills which are essential components in the field of computing. Second challenge was Data Detective .In this investigative task, students scoured the web for clues and piece together evidence to crack the case. The goal was to build their research skills and the practical application of data analysis in solving real-world problems.

Year 8 Camp




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






Sixth Form Students Inspire Younger Years with Game Design and Robotics


