The textile rooms have been a hive of activity with students in Years 7 & 8 learning a variety of traditional textile techniques to



design and make a Pencil Case or Phone Sock. During their lessons they have been following the design cycle to research existing products, design and develop their personal ideas. Machine and Hand Applique



are the main decorative techniques that students have been using to create their designs



out of fabric. They have also decorated their products with buttons, beads, and sequins. Year 7 students have been using hand embroidery stitches to construct and decorate their phone socks. Year 8 students have learnt how to use the sewing machine to construct their pencil cases and insert a Zip.

GCSE Exam Success

Huge congratulations to all our GCSE students who in June successfully completed their GCSE NEA and their Exams.The

results of their hard work were awarded and celebrated in August this year. Working with Mrs Ahluwalia over the last 3 years,

this year's GCSE students have been busy studying the theory content, as well as completing 2 practical Coursework based assignments in which they had to research, design, and make a product around a theme set by the exam board: Yr10 prac-



tice NEA – Children, Learning and Play. Yr11 NEA – 1 of 3 themes set by the exam board. The students and Mrs Ahluwalia had to overcome challenges of completing the course during the Covid Restrictions, which resulted in most of the teaching and learning being delivered in non-specialist rooms. For their



final NEA students designed a variety of textile-based products which included: a travel makeup bag, a dog coat, adjustable skirt, customisable shorts, reversible top, storage bean bag, a 2 in 1 blanket pillow and a Baby U-tube activity mat. Please see some pages from their NEA pro-

The class were extremely successful with 25% of students achieving a Grade 7 or above, 75% achieving a Grade 4 or above. 1 student in the textile class was awarded a Grade 9 for her NEA and Exam Results. She has gone on to study A-level Textiles at Haydon. A-level Exam Success

It has been a busy and productive 2 years for our A-level students. They have had to overcome many challenges impacted by the Covid Restrictions which involved them completing work at home, as well as having their own studio space



in the textiles department. Over the 2 years the students were able to complete 2 projects in which they had to research, design, and make an outcome around a topic of their choice related to the following themes: Yr 12 - Urban Nature, Yr13 Freedom and Limitations. At the end of year 12 all the students designed and made their garments which consisted of an Oceanic reverse applique corset and Harem pants, a heat manipulated bark like leather tube dress and a 60's inspired screen printed, and machine embroidered jump suit. In Year 13 the students' creativity continued to develop, with them looking at more conceptual topics. This resulted in them producing the following final out-



comes: A scrap book of photos and childhood memories made from fabric and textiles, a 3D instillation of fabric panels showing the movement of dancers, and a fabric collaged banner showing the contrasts in society between the rich and poor. The students did extremely well with all 3 students achieving a C grade or above. One student during her A-level studies has set up her own fashion and textile business in which she customises, design and makes her own clothes and accessories. She has gone on to continue to run this business full time. Another student was also studying textiles and has gone on to study Photography at University. Lateral flow tests on return to school in January 2022

Department for Education

The Department for Education would like all schools to test pupils for Covid via a lateral flow test onsite on their return to school in January. Parents have been sent an e-mail with details of the date and time of the tests for each year/form group. Only students who have consent and have completed the new consent form by 15 December will be able to have the test. Students who have had Covid within 90 days of the test do not need to take part in the testing. Students should wear a mask at the test site.
