Psychology trip to Brunel

Year 12 Psychology students recently enjoyed an exciting and informative trip to Brunel University London, where they were given the opportunity to experience university life and explore the fascinating world of psychology beyond the classroom.

The visit began with a guided tour of the campus. Although the weather was far from ideal and the rain certainly made the walk memorable, students still enjoyed seeing the impressive facilities and learning more about student life at university. The tour gave everyone a valuable insight into what studying at university could look like in the future.

During the day, students attended two engaging lectures delivered by university staff. The first focused on Cultural Psychology and explored how culture can influence human behaviour, attitudes and identity. Students were encouraged to think about how

psychological theories and research can vary across different societies and cultures. The second lecture introduced students to Neuropsychology, examining the relationship between the brain and behaviour. Students learned about how damage to different areas of the brain can affect memory, language and decision-making, linking closely to topics studied in lessons.

To finish the visit, students were given the opportunity to explore several of the university's psychology laboratories, where they saw how psychological research is carried out in real-world settings. Overall, the trip was an enjoyable and inspiring experience which helped students broaden their understanding of psychology and higher education opportunities.



Year 9 trip to Silverstone

On Monday we took 60 of our Year 9 students on a trip to Silverstone Circuit race track and museum. The students had a wonderful day, immersed in racing history and exploring the technology that goes into motorsports. They had the opportunity to learn about the career options within racing, whilst also getting to learn about the links between motorsport and the World Wars.

Although the weather was a bit wet, students still completed a track tour, finding out about some of the most significant parts of the circuit and the changes that have been put in place over the years to make races not only more exciting, but also safer. Overall, we had a lovely day and hope that the students have taken away a greater appreciation for the history, engineering, and teamwork involved in the world of motorsport.

Wednesday to Friday this week saw Year 10 students getting a taste of working life by taking part in our annual Year 10 Work Experience. There have been a whole range of placements including primary schools, football clubs, accountancy and retail. 
activities to help raise their aspirations, focus their career pathways and look at key personality characteristics to make them as employable as possible in the future.
