We have now set up a specialist pastoral support area within the school - named the Haydon Hive (formerly the Language college building). The Haydon Hive has now become the central base for all of the pastoral support services at Haydon including our SEN Department, Link Support, Medical Room, Counselling Team and Safeguarding team. There will be more details of the Haydon Hive throughout this year - so please watch this space.

**Mental Health**

Based over in our new Haydon Hive I am really proud of the fact that we now have a team of 6 school counsellors able to work with and support the students here at Haydon. Every single one of us over the last eighteen months, have had our mental health impacted to some degree or other. Traditionally mental Health has been seen as a bit of a taboo subject so these days more than ever - it is vital that as a school we are actively working to promote good mental health and support members of our school community who are in need of additional support. Ensuring that we are all in good mental health is now more important than ever. So please if you do have concerns over your child's mental health do not hesitate to contact your year team or a member of the Safeguarding Team to see how we can best support, whether it be in school support or through external agencies.

**In regards to external support - please see below from CAMHS -**

Children, young people and their families can get free help, advice and urgent mental health support from 24/7 crisis telephone lines available in every London borough.

Every NHS mental health trust in London has put these in place, so children, young people and their families can get help quickly when they need it. Professionals are also able to access these crisis lines

if they are concerned about or would like advice about a child, young person or family. The crisis lines are supported by trained mental health practitioners, who can offer advice and signpost other sources of support as needed.

## Everyone's Invited

Finally I am sure that all of you will have either read or watched the news from earlier this year regarding the Everyone's invited Campaign and the OFSTED report into Sexual abuse and Harassment within our schools.

**As a school I just wanted to take this opportunity to share with you the steps we have taken so far to address the issues of sexual harassment and abuse at Haydon.**

- At the start of this academic year each year group had an assembly focusing on Sexual Harassment and abuse and how we as a school will be dealing with any incidents that are disclosed to the school.
- At the start of this academic year staff also received training on how we as a school will be dealing with any reported incidents of sexual harassment and abuse and how as a school we will be taking a zero tolerance approach to this issue.
- Staff and students have set up a group called 'The Women Who Care'. The purpose of this group is for the older students to run sessions with the younger ones about feminism, empowerment and issues like consent and would also provide a peer-support group that the younger girls could turn to.
- We have ensured that one of the topics being covered in our Safeguarding Week for our KS4 students is on the issue of Consent.
