COVID-19 TESTING



The Lateral Flow Testing has worked extremely well and I have been really impressed with the maturity of the students. I would like to thank all of the staff involved in the organisation and delivery of this enormous challenge, particularly Ms Faraj, Ms Hurley, Ms Lofty and Ms Kelly.

The staff undertaking the testing have been remarkable! When I first was informed that schools were expected to do this in December last year, it filled me with fear but I cannot praise the staff highly enough who have led and undertaken this task in school.

Having completed over 4500 Lateral Flow Tests in school, students have now been issued with Home Testing Kits. The Department for Education has asked me to highlight the following:

- Test twice a week at home from now on (all those who are able to)
- Report results online as positive, negative or void. This information is critical in helping us to understand the prevalence of the virus across the country
- Continue to test twice weekly over the Easter holidays
- Test before returning to school or college for the summer term, either the night before, or morning of, the first day back, to find and isolate any positive cases
- If you receive a positive LFD result you should book a confirmatory PCR test https://www.gov.uk/getcoronavirus-test. We would advise visiting a community or drive through test site as this is the quickest way to get tested, or you can order a home test kit. It is important that you self-isolate until the result of your PCR test.
- If you receive two void results in a row you should book a PCR test.


PRIZE GIVING






Alongside this, students have been practicing their exam technique and essay writing skills and we hope that the students have found this useful.






