Extended Project Qualification Results (EPQ)

17 Year 13 Haydon students and their families celebrated outstanding results for their EPQ projects this year, with EPQ lead Mrs Foxon and the team of supervisors.

Over 50% of the students achieved the highest A* grade and over 75% achieved either an A* or an A grade.

EPQs are formal qualifications which allow students to explore areas of personal interest outside the curriculum of standard A Levels. EPQs help students develop a vital range of extra study skills, helping prepare them for the demands of university work. It is valued by Universities, as it demonstrates a huge dedication to independent learning and is often included in offers made by institutions to applicants.

Some examples of projects this year were:

- Should Artificial Intelligence be used to fully automate diagnoses for the NHS?
- Do environmental influences affect a child's stress responses more than epigenetic inheritance?
- To design and produce a scale model of a space capsule body for long-term accommodation, reviewing features against conventional capsule structures.
- Is It Beneficial To Broadcast Judicial Proceedings, And Does It Influence Public Attitudes?

Oxbridge University Research Project at Haydon

Haydon School has been selected, along with 6 other schools in England, by researchers at the University of Oxford, to take part in a highly significant study investigating the relationships between technology use in schools and social and educational equity. As part of the study, the researcher Dr Valentina Andries will be based at Haydon and will observe technology use in different classrooms with different year groups. 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
House Results
