Sixth Form Meetings

Following the successful Year 11 mock examinations, the Sixth Form team and various Senior Leaders have begun interviewing over 230 students for places in Sixth Form for the next academic year. Our staff have been incredibly impressed with the maturity and focus of our Year 11 students in these interviews. We are excited that we will be welcoming so many of our Year 11 students back for Sixth Form after what I'm sure will be a successful summer examination period.

University & Apprenticeship applications

We are delighted that 160 of our Year 13 students have applied to University or Degree Level apprenticeships. Students are becoming excited as they have started receiving their offers of places for next year. We also have a large number of students who have been called for interviews at Oxford, Cambridge, Veterinary and Medical schools. I am delighted that five of our students have been offered a place at Cambridge and one at Oxford. We also have another student who has been offered a place at medical school with a number of others called awaiting an interview. I would like to thank Ms Baker-Perkins and Ms McAviley who have worked extremely hard supporting our students with their applications.

As we near the halfway point in the year, it is important to keep attendance to school near the top of our agenda. Like most other secondary schools nationally, our attendance has not yet returned to pre-covid levels, as attitudes towards missing school have, understandably, changed. It is very important that both students and parents understand that every day matters. Over the course of a school day, students learn and consolidate hundreds of new skills, both academically and socially. Ad-hoc absence from schools prevents this from happening. Uniform Policy Update

We are now two weeks into the implementation of our new uniform policy and I'm pleased to say that standards of uniform have improved significantly. Students look smart, well presented and are wearing their uniform with pride. Wearing the correct uniform is also linked with good behaviour in schools and I'm pleased to say that behaviour points across the entire school are down 6.2% over the last two weeks compared to the two weeks prior to the new uniform policy starting. I'd like to thank parents and carers for their support in ensuring their child is wearing the correct uniform to school each day. Please be reminded that if students come to a school with an item of uniform missing but bring a note, they will not receive a sanction but will still be expected to get changed into the correct uniform. Year 9 Holocaust Educational Talk

Year 9 received an exceptional talk from Generation to Generation on the Holocaust, an area that students had studied at the end of Year 8. The speaker spoke about their mother's experience living in Poland before Nazi occupation and then how she was transferred to the ghetto, then to Auschwitz and finally to a labour camp in Berlin before being rescued by the Swedish government in 1945. The speaker highlighted the importance of respect and understanding between people of different backgrounds and was able to bring her mother's testimony alive through videos and images of her experience. We thoroughly enjoy working with Generation to Generation and I heard lots of positive feedback from the students in the assembly. Students now have the opportunity to build on this knowledge by taking the History GCSE. Mr Cooper is also in the process of planning a trip to Berlin for GCSE History students to help really cement students' understanding of this topic.

Safer Internet Day

On 6th February, it is Safer Internet Day. This is an annual event. 2024 sees the theme: 'Inspiring change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'. Pupils across the school who study Computing will have lessons delivered focusing on this topic. Year 8 will have an assembly presented to them that focuses on risks and tips for how to stay safe online. All year groups will have resources delivered within form time that will allow them to explore and discuss age-specific risks. Year 10 and Year 12 Parliament and Supreme Court Trip

On Thursday, 25 January, Year 12 Politics students and Year 10 Citizenship students travelled to Parliament and the Supreme Court to learn more about Britain's political system and careers in Politics and the law. Students listened to presentations from local MP David Simmonds and member of the House of Lords Baroness Blower. They heard from parliamentary researchers and political advisers about their route into political jobs, as well as the kind of duties they perform as part of their jobs.
