Uniform Update

As you are aware, we introduced our new uniform policy last term which has been well received and supported by all stakeholders. The changes implemented have had a significant impact in maintaining consistent standards of uniform amongst our students which have definitely contributed to the students' general deportment.

However, in spite of the success of the changes implemented, a survey amongst the students revealed dissatisfaction with the design and fit of the current uniform skirt which results in students wearing the skirt incorrectly. As such, we have made the decision to change the uniform skirt and have liaised with our uniform providers to secure a new style of skirt that should prove to be a better fit for our range of students. The new skirt is therefore now available at Beats School Uniform for purchase and can be worn alongside the current skirt if purchased. However, this will not be a compulsory item until the next academic school year. Please note that there are no changes to the rest of the uniform items and the new skirt is at the same cost as the existing one.













As it relates to uniform in general, please be reminded that the standards are to be upheld despite the changing weather. As such, please ensure that your child wears the correct items of uniform daily along with a suitable coat to wear to and from school. Please remind them that incorrect items of uniform such as hoodies and sports jackets are not allowed and will be confiscated if worn. We ask that you continue to support the school in this regard as we strive to maintain high standards within the school community,

Site Update

All our solar panels are now operational and producing electricity for our school. Air conditioning units are being fitted in Dobson Building and the project should be completed within this academic year. We are already saving significantly on the electricity costs which can then be recycled into other areas to support student outcomes.

Our flood resilience project is progressing well and the rain garden in front of our Reception should finish in May. In July, we will start working on our second rain garden near our library. The school received a specific grant for this project, and we look forward to seeing the final results.

Sixth Form

I'd like to wish Year 12 well with the mock examinations they are currently taking. These examinations are a great indicator of the progress they have made since beginning their A Level courses. The results of these examinations will help students begin to plan for the University and Degree Apprenticeship applications they will be making and so are an incredibly important part of their Sixth Form journey.

Year 13 begin their last few weeks of study at Haydon with their final day being Friday 10th May, before commencing study leave and their summer examinations. The final day will involve a Leavers Breakfast and Leavers assembly which will be an excellent way to celebrate what for many of them will be the end of 7 years in our school community.
